## Report of Research

## Major Research Interests:

1. Family Violence and development across the life-span.
2. Child Sexual abuse and its consequences
3. Parental cognition and behavior and child development.
4. Professional responses to intrafamilial abuse and violence and their impacts.

## Description of Research:

My major areas of research have focused on the development of parental understanding of children and childrearing, child abuse and child development, and the effects of sexual abuse on children and their mothers. The research on parental development draws on social cognitive theory to define stages in parental conceptions of children and childrearing and the relation of those stages to parental treatment of their children, including child abuse. The Parental Awareness Measure developed from this work is now used in research projects around the world. The second area of concentration has been on various aspects of child maltreatment and its effects. The findings of the Victim Recovery Study, a longitudinal study of children and their mothers following a disclosure of sexual abuse of the child, include the psychiatric impact on women of their children's abuse and its aftermath (published in the American Journal of Orthopsychiatry), and racial and social class differences in the distribution of professional interventions and their relationship to recovery.
